Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street. From the IRT Flushing Line #7: train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the Hospital. Statement of Need

Stroke is a devastating event that can lead to serious long-term disability. Every year, more than 795,000 people in the United States experience a stroke. About 610,000 of these are first or new strokes. Stroke risk increases with age, but strokes canand do-occur at any age. This 5th Annual Stroke and Neurocritical Care Conference will provide physicians and health care providers with evidence-based updates on the latest stroke assessment and therapeutic approaches to optimize successful patient outcomes.

Target Audience

Primary care physicians, neurologists, neurosurgeons, ER physicians, residents, fellows, interns, medical students, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, registered nurses, EMT's and others involved in the care of stroke patients.
